


ACTIVITIES FOR JUNE - AUGUST 2018

On August 19th, 2018, at the big square on the promenade, with the support of AICS Tirana, NAPA and UNDP Albania, was organized the activity on promoting the natural values and tourist attractions in



Vlora Region. The aim was to inform tourists and every citizen about the importance of protected

areas and their role in the sustainable development of tourism in the Vlora region. The broadcasted video and the stands of National Marine Park Karaburun-Sazan transmitted the unique biodiversity values of the area.

With the support from UNDP Albania and through close cooperation with Vlora Municipality, the Visitors Center of National Marine Park Karaburun Sazan, will be more visible and accessible by tourists, through installation of 8 directional signs positioned on the access roads from both sides of the VC. There are installed 5 signs along the road Vlora - Radhima and 3 signs along the road Llogara – Radhima.

In cooperation with the border police, a number of inspections were conducted at the National Marine Park Karaburun-Sazan on illegal activities in the area with focus on illegal fishing.

A number of coordinating meetings have been held with relevant institutions such as County Prefect, Municipality, Port Authority, Border & Migration Directorate, Harbormaster, and with the participation of

representatives of UNDP Albania, local media and touristic operators who offer boat tours at the National Marine Park Karaburun-Sazan. The purpose of these meetings was to coordinate the actions with tourism institutions and operators in the context of facilitating the visitors' navigation and transportation procedures and avoiding the negative impacts on the NMP K-S from tourism in this area and from illegal fishing.

During the period June-August 2018, several sea turtles of *Caretta caretta* species were assisted at the Sea Turtles Rehabilitation and Recovery Center in Radhima. For each individual were performed the appropriate check-ups followed by relevant treatment with medications and vitamins, as



needed. Turtles are placed in the relevant recovery aquarium, and then are cleansed and returned to the sea. It is greatly appreciated the commitment of RAPA Vlorë staff and relevant experts.

In the framework of the joint program "Junior Ranger", and aiming the experience exchange among the young people of both Vlora and Elbasan RAPAs, a visit was organized to the National Marine Park Karaburun-Sazan, with the young people that participate in this program. During this visit the young people became acquainted with the natural values of the park, its typical characteristics, biodiversity, etc.

Under the slogan "Where nature and Antiquity go hand in hand", has started the testing of eco-tourism package of protected areas in Vlora region, conceived in cooperation with local actors to guarantee the transmittal of authentic taste of the area's natural and cultural values with the lowest impact on the environment.

During the summer season of 2018, at the NMP K-S Visitors Center has started the implementation of the Inters program. For this purpose, with the support of UNDP Albania and in cooperation with the University of Vlora, six students of Biology Department have been engaged in the program. They are involved in various tasks, mainly of explanatory and promotional character for the region in general and NMP K-S in particular. This program is foreseen to continue for the next seasons in the framework of continuous cooperation with university.

Visitors Center of NMP K-S, supported by UNDP Albania, has already developed the document of Strategy and Action Plan in support of its operation and functionality. Contacts and discussions with local partners and actors have been an integral part of the entire process of drafting and finalizing this document. The goal is to co-operate and implement activities foreseen by and with partners to develop a model center for the park and area visitors.



DID YOU KNOW?

Visitors at the National Marine Park Karaburun-Sazan


The first touristic visits to the Marine National Park Karaburun-Sazan for 2018 occurred in March, with 30 visitors and peaked in August with 38,723 visitors. For the period March-August 2018, the NMP was visited by 63,300 visitors in total.

The table above and the following figure highlight an increasing trend in the number of visitors at the MPA K-S, with the “peak” being reached in August, when the number of visitors has been 6 and 3 times higher compared to the preceding summer months, July and June, respectively.

This fact demonstrates that there is an exponentially higher demand during August, and indeed this has to be managed

either through good planning, or through diversification of the offer, i.e. providing other recreational activities in addition to the ones performed so far.



As regards the nationality of MPA visitors, it is noticed that there is almost the same number of both groups (Albanians and Foreigners) with just a slight difference in favor of Albanian Visitors. This proves that the area continues to be a very attractive tourist destination for Albanian citizens.

Visitors at the Visitors Center, Radhima


Visitors Center in Radhima, strategically positioned between Vloora and Orikum city is becoming more and more an important focal point where visitors/tourists receive various tourist information and are virtually acquainted with the area and its attractions.

For 2018, registration of visitors in this center started in March with 58 visitors, peaking in August with 729 visitors. During the period March-August 2018, the VC was visited by 1912 visitors in total.

The table above and the following figure highlight that the presence of visitors to the VC follows the same trend as that of visitors/tourists visiting NMP K-S, indicating the

linkage between these two structures as well as their mutual benefit.



It is noticed that the largest number of visitors at the VC belongs to foreign tourists. This shows an increasing interest in obtaining preliminary information on the area and the various activities or services provided. Visitors get the first 'feeling and taste' of the area's amenities, therefore visiting the VC is becoming more and more part of the tourist packages offered by different operators.
